At the 'Advanced Eye Centre,' Byculla, Dr Cyres Mehta, the centre's head uses the Italian Optikon Pulsar S2 touchscreen cataract removal Micro-phaco unit (used for the first time in Mumbai in 2006). This system is specially customised by the company in Rome for him. Even very hard cataracts can be removed safely through just 0.7 mm incision. Usual techniques of Phaco use a 2.8 mm incision (ie. 4 times bigger). Cases of diabetes and heart patients can have their cataracts extracted in total safety. The patient resumes work the next day with just a 1-hour stay. Dr Cyres Mehta is an exponent of this 0.7 mm technique and has taught this technique to surgeons in London in September 2006 at the European Society of Cataract surgeons. Dr Cyres is a gold medal awardee of the Intraocular Implant Society of India for work on phaco cataract surgery and is the Outstanding Young Indian of 2005 awardee at the hands of Shri R R Patil, Deputy CM, and Padmavibhushan Dr BK Goyal.
